In August 2002, at the Commonwealth Games in Manchester, Adam made a dramatic return to International swimming by winning the men's 100m breaststroke and taking a further two silver medals, making him the most successful male swimmer at the games. Twelve months previously Adam had virtually quit the sport following a dramatic failure at the Sydney Olympics, where he crashed out in 21st place. After suffering back and knee injuries and a bout of depression, the turnaround was remarkable. He puts it all down to a mental strength and a tenacious will to succeed. Adam has spent eight years at the top of his sport both domestically and on the world stage.
